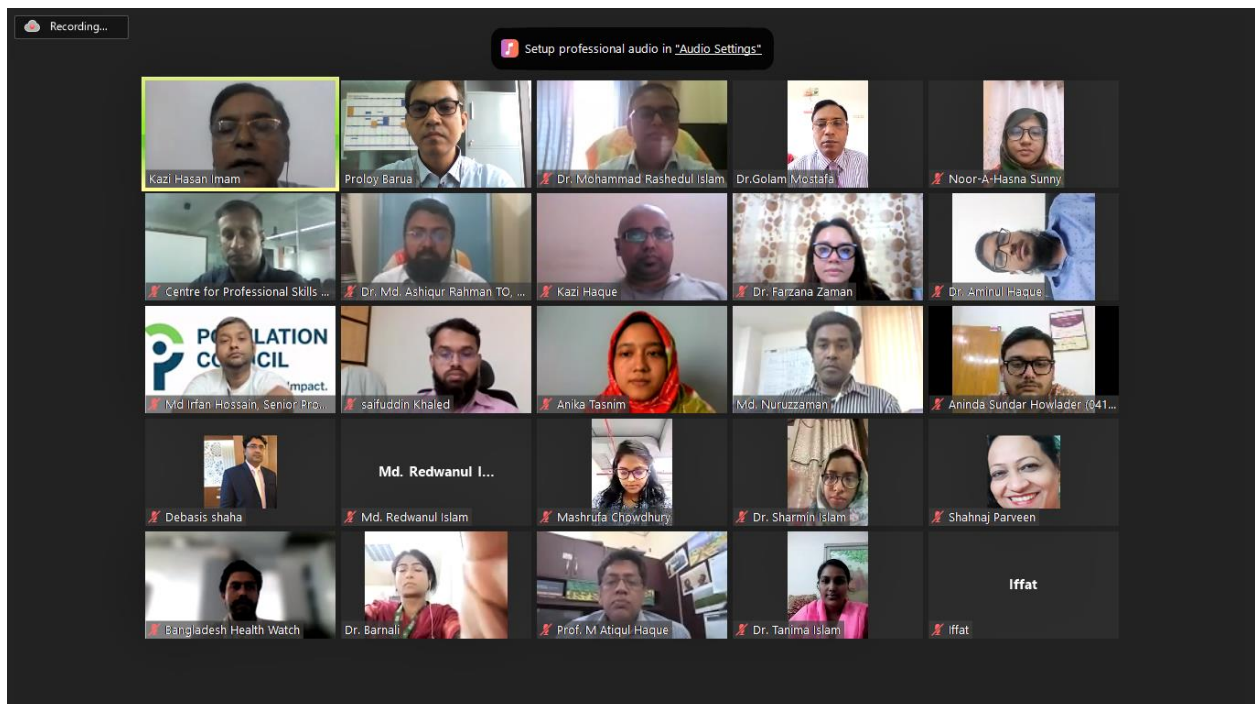


Equity for Accessing Healthcare Services

Brief:

Equity in Accessing Healthcare Services short course is designed for public health professionals developed by the Centre for Professional Skills Development in Public Health (CPSD) at BRAC James P Grant School of Public Health, BRAC University in collaboration with Bangladesh Health Watch (BHW) and Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA)

The short course has four interrelated sub-themes: Theme-1: Foundational knowledge on Health Equity: Importance of Health Equity to public health and society as whole. Theme-2: Health inequities and their root causes: Social Determinants of Health (SDOH). Theme-3: Pathways to Health Equity: Achieving of Universal Health Coverage (UHC), its challenges and ways forward. Theme-4: The Service Delivery Improvement Project (SDIP): A practical tool for equity related project planning and management
